BEFORE INSTALLING THE RANGE HOOD

READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK, OR INJURY TO PERSON(S) OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 Use this unit only in the manner intended by the manufacturer. If you have questions, contact the manufacturer at the address or telephone number listed in the warranty.
- 2 Before servicing or cleaning unit, switch power off at service panel and lock service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 3 Installation work and electrical wiring must be done by qualified personnel in accordance with all applicable codes and standards, including fire-rated construction codes and standards.
- 4 Sufficient air is needed for proper combustion and exhausting of gases through the duct of fuel burning equipment to prevent backdrafting. Follow the heating equipment manufacturer's guidelines and safety standards such as those published by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the American Society for Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) and the local code authorities.
- 5 This product may have sharp edges. Be careful to avoid cuts and abrasions during installation or cleaning.
- 6 When cutting or drilling into wall or ceiling, do not damage electrical wiring and other hidden utilities.
- 7 Ducted fans must always be vented to the outdoors.
- 8 Do not use this unit with any other solid-state speed control device.
- 9 Use only metal ductwork.
- 10 This unit must be grounded.

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF A RANGE TOP GREASE FIRE:

- 1 Never leave surface units unattended at high settings. Boilovers cause smoking and greasy spillovers that may ignite. Heat oils slowly on low or medium settings.
- 2 Always turn hood ON when cooking at high heat or when cooking flaming foods (i.e. Crêpes Suzette, Cherries Jubilee, Peppercorn Beef Flambe).
- 3 Clean ventilating fans frequently. Grease should not be allowed to accumulate on fan or filters.
- 4 Use proper pan size. Always use cookware appropriate for the size of the surface element.

⚠ WARNING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY TO PERSON(S) IN THE EVENT OF A RANGE TOP GREASE FIRE, OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING*:

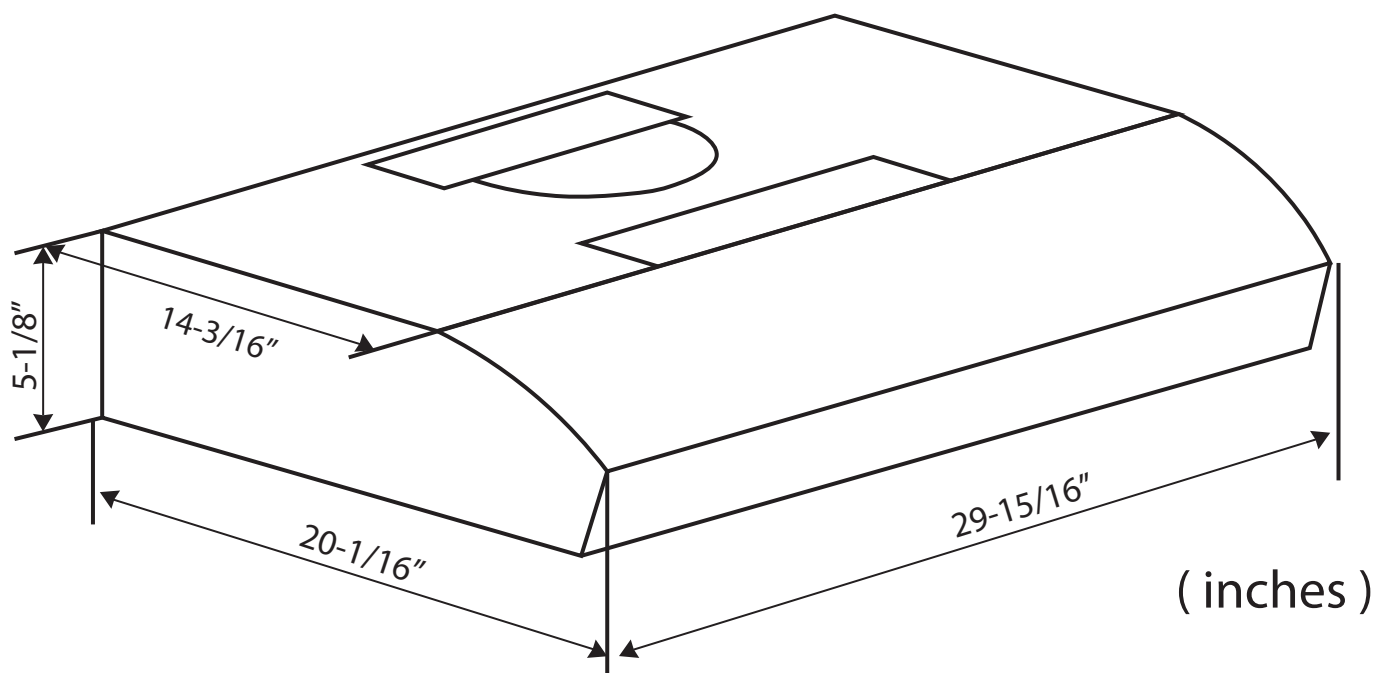
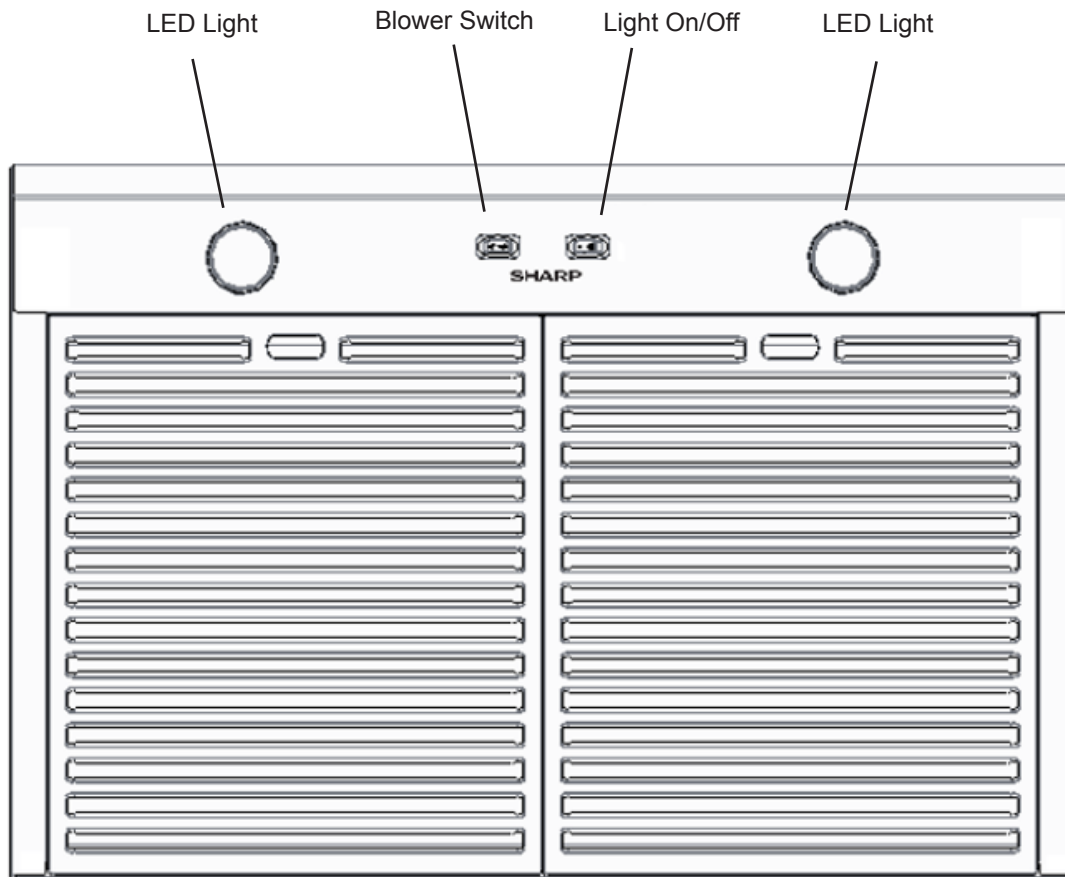
- 1 For indoor use only.

- 4 Your hood motor has a thermal overload which will automatically shut off the motor if it becomes overheated. The motor will restart when it cools down. If the motor continues to shut off and restart, have the hood serviced.
- 5 For best capture of cooking fumes, the bottom of the hood MUST NOT BE LESS than 18" for electric range or 26" for gas range and at a recommended maximum of 30" above the cooking surface.
- 6 Two installers are recommended because of the size of this hood.
- 7 To reduce risk of fire and to properly exhaust air, be sure to duct air outside. Do not exhaust air into spaces within walls or ceilings or into attics, crawl spaces, or garages.
- 8 Be careful when installing the duct and hood, they may have sharp edges.
- 9 Please read specification label on product for further information and requirements.

Distances over 30" are at the installer and user discretion.

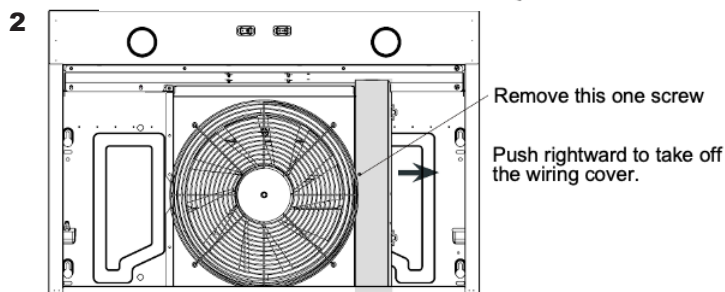
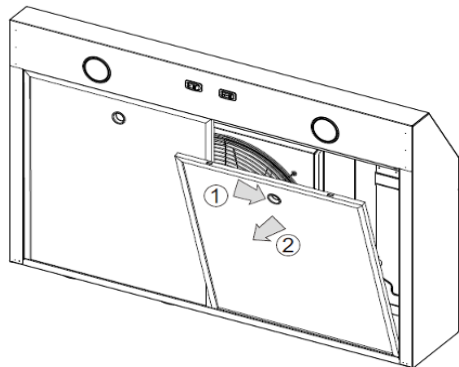
- 1** Determine whether hood will discharge vertically (3 1/4" x 10" or 7" round), or horizontally (3 1/4" x 10" only).
- 2** Decide where the ductwork will run between the hood and the outdoors.
- 3** Choose a straight, short duct run to allow the hood to perform most efficiently. Long duct runs, elbows and transitions will reduce the performance of the hood. Use as few of them as possible. When possible, use at least 2 foot straight runs before any turns. Larger ductwork may be required for best performance with longer duct runs.
- 4** Install wall cap or roof cap (sold separately); ensure there is no leak in house insulation.
- 5** Connect metal ductwork to cap and work back towards the hood location. Use 2" metal foil duct tape to seal the joints between ductwork sections.

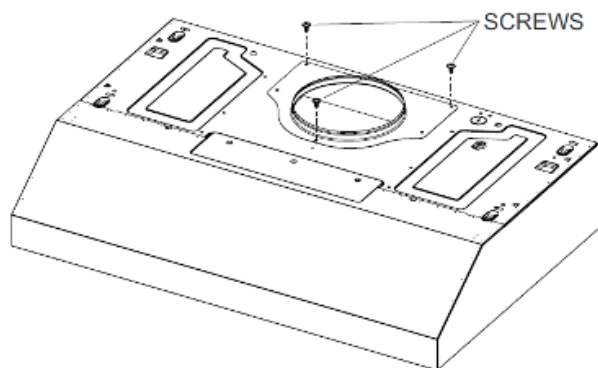
PREPARE THE HOOD

NOTE: If present, remove all protective polyfilm from the hood and/or parts.

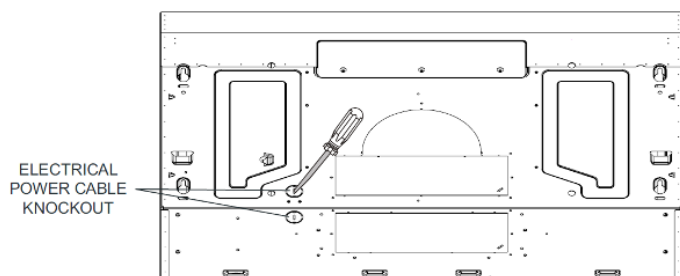
- 1 Remove the filters by pushing down 1 and tilting filters out 2.



- 3 Use Philips screwdriver to remove the 3 screws on the 7" round duct. Take off the 7" round duct.



- 4 Remove Electrical Power Cable Knockout suitable for your installation and install appropriate 1/2" strain relief (not included).

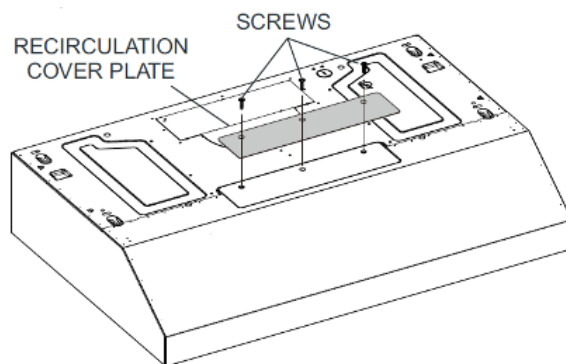


REMOVE KNOCKOUT PLATES

There are three different preparations depending on your installation method.

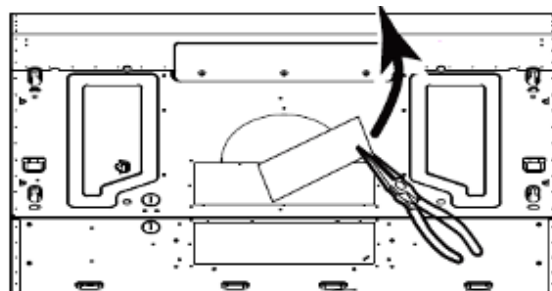
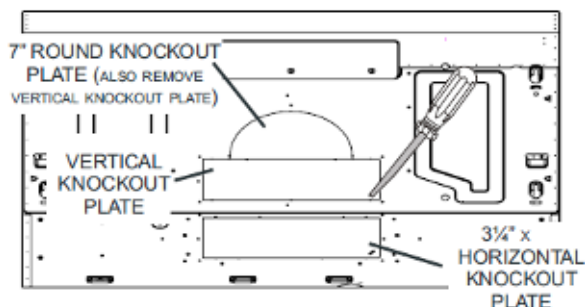
A. FOR RECIRCULATION INSTALLATION

Remove 3 screws retaining the recirculation cover plate to the hood. This plate is not needed for recirculation. Discard or keep for future use. Peel off and discard the membrane covering the recirculation grille, ensuring the openings are totally cleared.



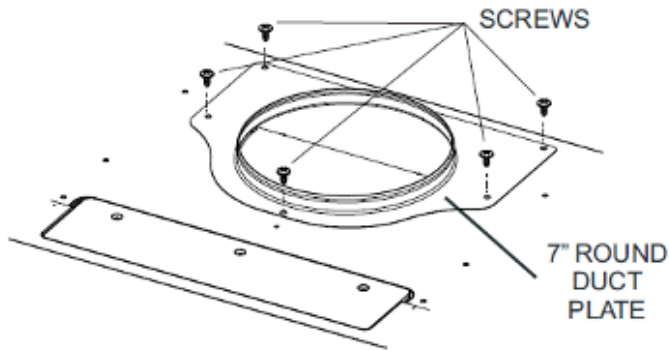
B. FOR DUCTED INSTALLATION - ROUND DUCTING

- 1 Remove the following knockout plates on the hood. Horizontal knockout plate (3 1/4" x 10") on the top AND 7-inch round knockout.

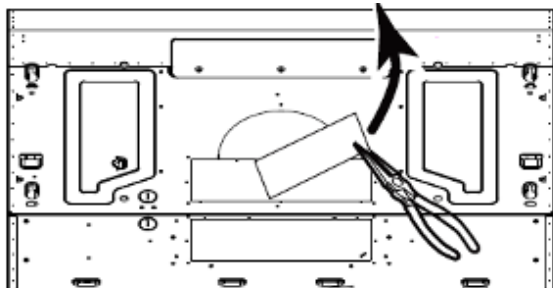
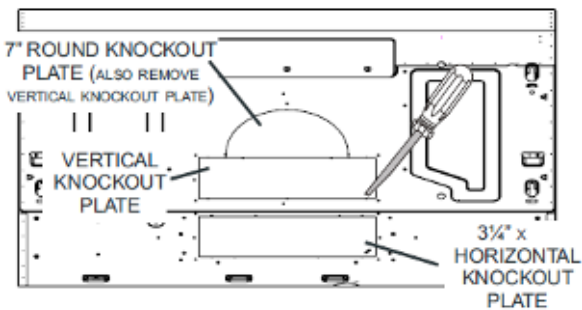
- 2 Attach 7" Round Duct Plate over the knockout opening with 3/16" x 5/16" screws.



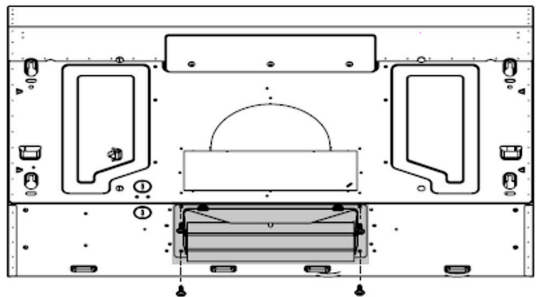
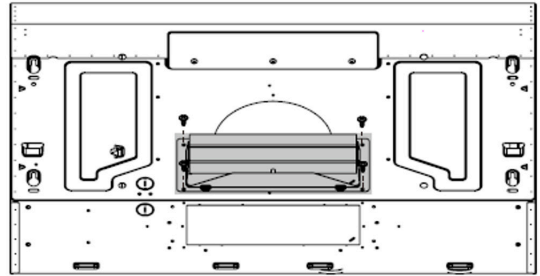
TIP: Insert a small length of 7" round duct and seal the joint using aluminum foil duct tape to ease connection with the house duct work.

C. FOR DUCTED INSTALLATION - RECTANGULAR DUCTING

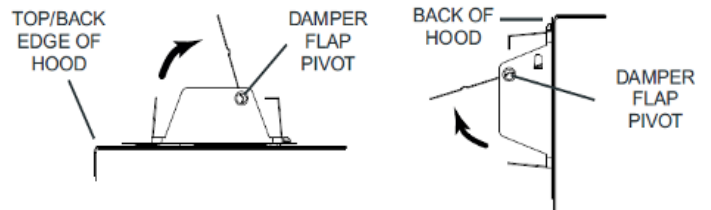
- 1 Remove a knockout plate as appropriate for your installation method. Horizontal knockout plate (3/4" x 10") on the back OR Vertical knockout plate (3/4" x 10") on the top.



- 2 Attach a rectangular damper included (3/4" x 10") over the knockout opening with the 3/16" x 5/16" screws.



- 3 When installed, the 3/4" x 10" damper assembly must open as shown below.



TIP: Insert a small length of duct over the 3/4" x 10" damper assembly and seal the joint using aluminum foil duct tape to ease connection with the house ductwork.

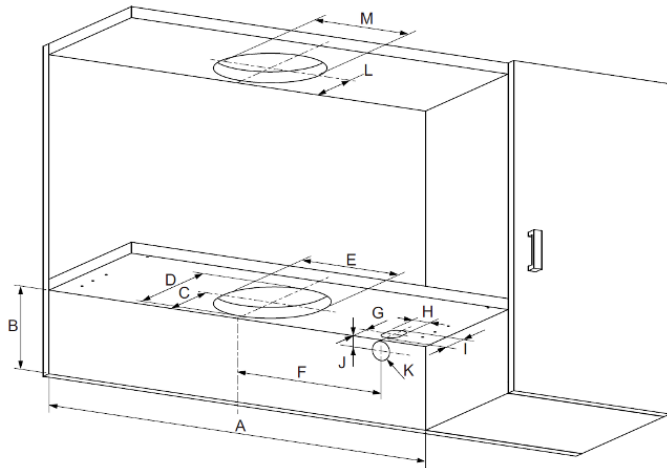
INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

PREPARE THE HOOD LOCATION

This manual covers 2 kinds of installation: the standard (without preformed brackets) and the preformed one-person installation system (using included brackets).

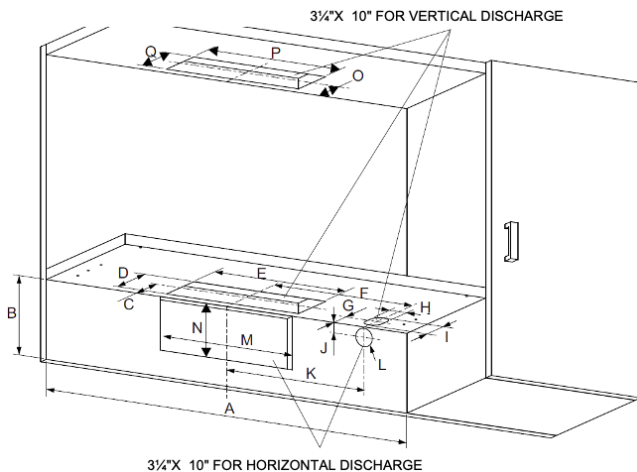
Cut the ducting holes and the hole for the wire to go through inside the cabinet, according to the ducting way you choose.

A. FOR 7" ROUND DUCT

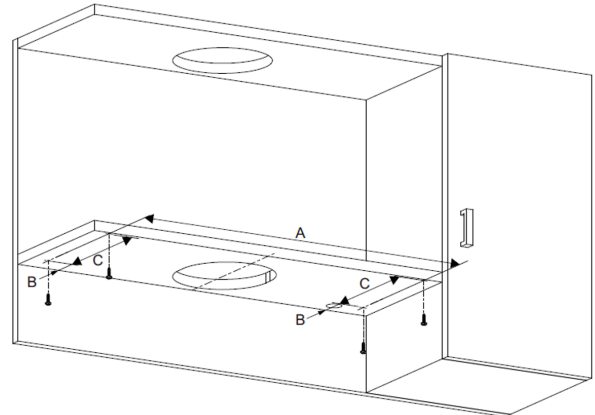

INSTALL THE HOOD

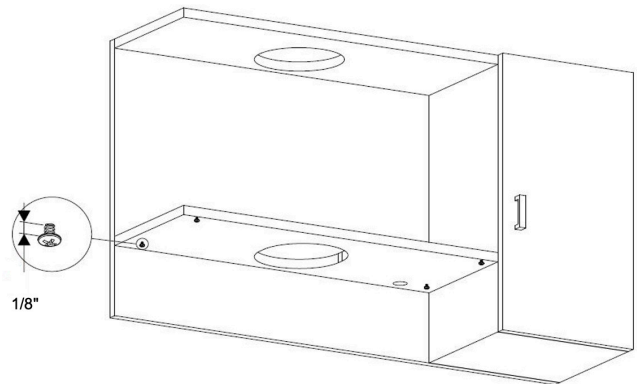
A. STANDARD INSTALLATION (WITHOUT PREFORMED BRACKETS)

- 1 Run house power cable between service panel and hood location.
- 2 Installing 4 pcs ST 3/16" x 9/16" screws (large flat head self tapping) into the cabinet according to the positions on the below drawing.

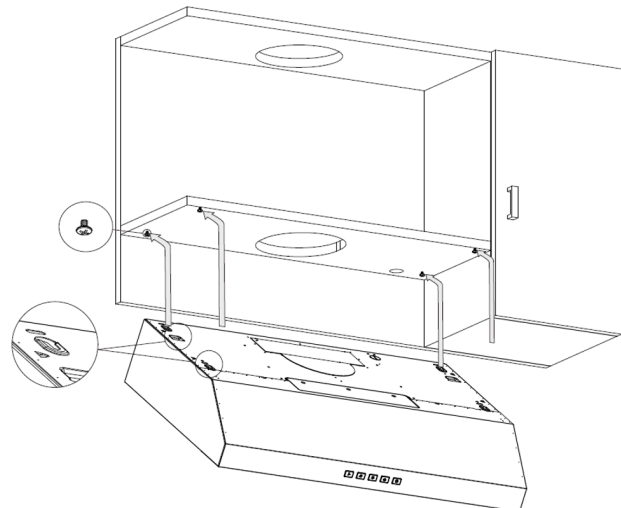


A=27 1/4"; B=2 1/16"; C=8 7/8"

NOTICE: Leave 1/8" between the screw head and the cabinet.

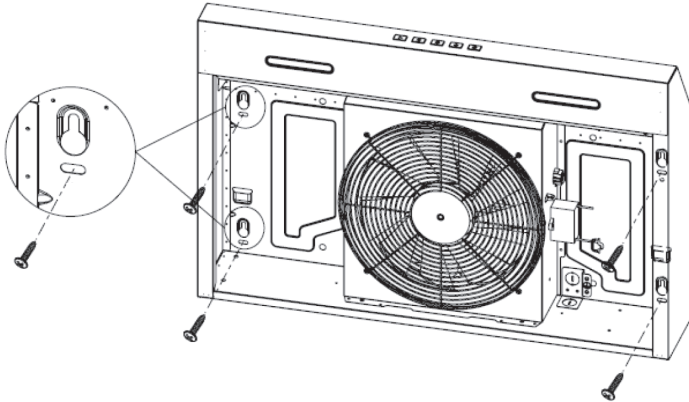


- 3 Lift the hood. Insert the 4 holes onto the screws. Slide the hood in place.

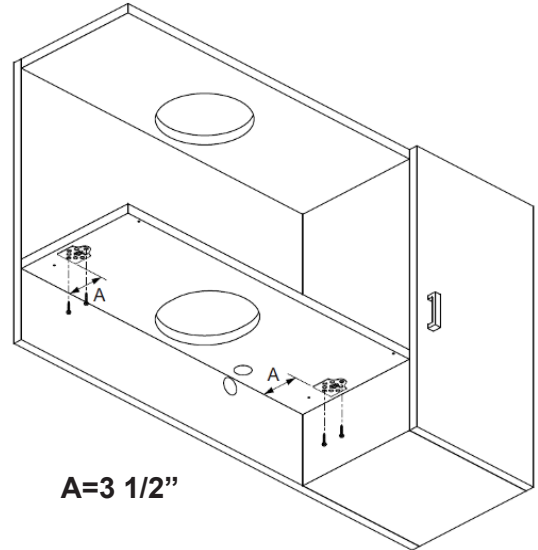
- 4 While holding the hood, run the house power cable into the hood through the strain relief previously installed.
- 5 Use 2 pcs 3/16" x 9/16" screws (large flat head self tapping) to fix the hood.



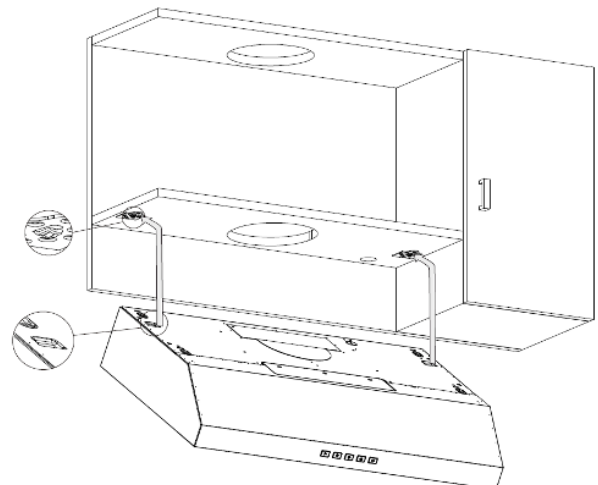
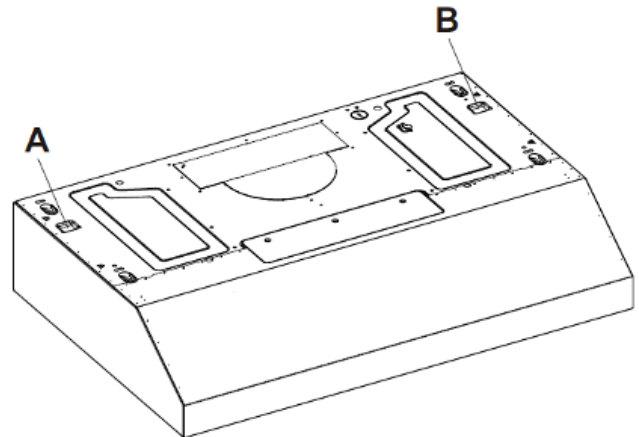
- 6 Then tighten the other 4 pcs ST 3/16" x 9/16" screws that are installed as step 2.
- 7 **(FOR DUCTED INSTALLATION ONLY)**
Connect the ductwork to the hood and use metal foil duct tape to make joints secure and air-tight. Make sure the damper assembly (or round duct plate) enters the ductwork and that the damper opens and closes freely.

B. INSTALLATION WITH PREFORMED BRACKETS

- 1 Run house power cable between service panel and hood location.
- 2 Use 4 pcs ST 3/16: x 5/8" screws (countersunk self tapping) to fix the 2 pcs preformed brackets onto the cabinet.

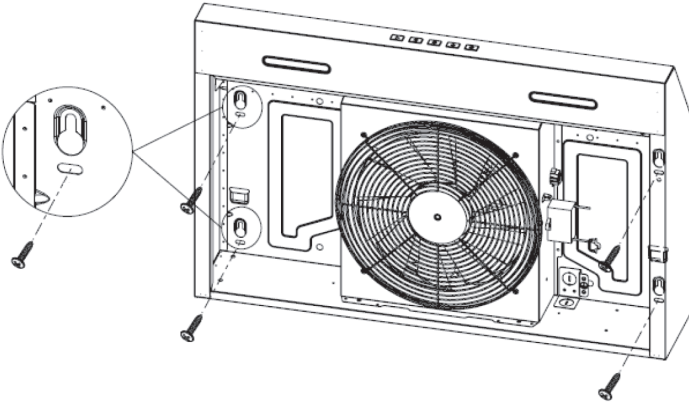


- 3 Lift the hood. Insert the A B positions of the hood into the preformed bracket.



INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- 4 TEMPORARILY** hang the hood by the preformed brackets. While holding the hood, run the house power cable into the hood through the strain relief previously installed.
- 5** Fasten the hood by installing 4 pcs ST 3/16" x 9/16" screws (large flat head self tapping) into slots.



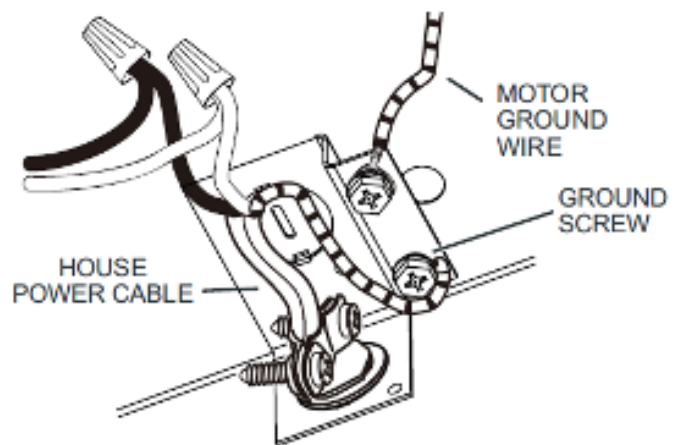
6 (FOR DUCTED INSTALLATION ONLY)

Connect the ductwork to the hood and use metal foil duct tape to make joints secure and air-tight. Make sure the damper assembly (or round duct plate) enters the ductwork and that the damper opens and closes freely.

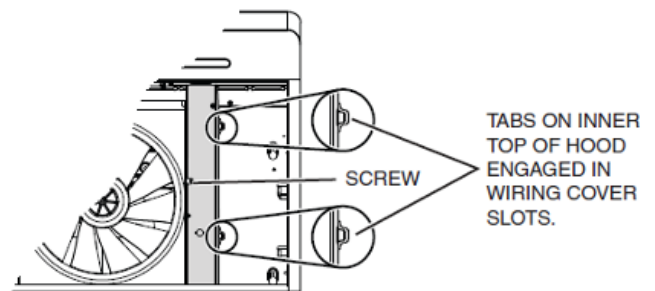
CONNECT THE WIRING

⚠ WARNING	
	Risk of electric shock. Electrical wiring must be done by qualified personnel in accordance with all applicable codes and standards. Before connecting wires, switch power off at service panel and lock service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally.

- 1** Connect House Power Cable to range hood wiring: **BLACK to BLACK, WHITE to WHITE and GREEN or bare wire under GREEN ground screw.**



- 2** Reinstall wiring cover and attach it to the hood using its retaining screw.



INSTALL THE FILTERS

(FOR DUCTED INSTALLATION ONLY)

Re-install grease filters removed in step 1, under "Prepare the Hood".

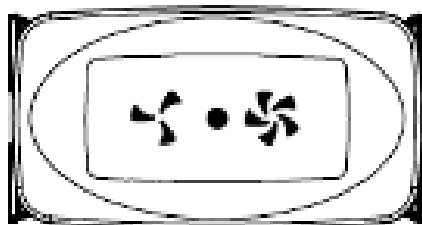
(FOR NON-DUCTED INSTALLATION ONLY)

Purchase two non-ducted filters from your local retailer or call 1-800-BE-SHARP (see product specification label for filter type). Attach the non-ducted filters following instructions packed with the non-ducted filters.

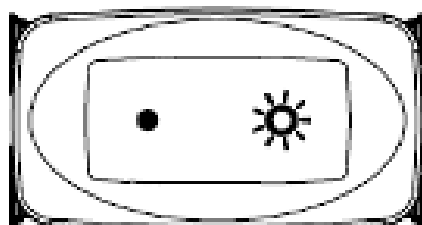
Always turn your hood on before you begin cooking to establish an air flow in the kitchen. Let the blower run for a few minutes to clear the air after you turn off the range. This will help keep the whole kitchen cleaner and fresher.

Operate the hood as follows:

A. BLOWER SWITCH



1. Press  to turn on blower at low speed.
2. Press  to turn blower off.
3. Press  to turn on blower at high speed.



1. Press  to turn light on.
2. Press  to turn light off.

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

Proper maintenance of the Range Hood will assure proper performance of the unit.

MOTOR

The motor is permanently lubricated and never needs oiling. If the motor bearings make excessive or unusual noise, replace the blower with the exact service blower.

CONTROL PANEL SURFACE

The inlay control panel can be cleaned using warm soapy water. Ensure the cloth is clean and well wrung before cleaning. Use a dry soft cloth to remove any excess moisture left after cleaning.

IMPORTANT

Use mild liquid dish detergents and avoid using harsh cleaning chemicals, strong household detergents or products containing abrasives, as this will affect the appearance of the appliance and potentially remove any printing of artwork on the control panel and may void manufacturer's warranty.

GREASE FILTERS

Remove grease filters by pulling down on the metal latch tab. This will disengage the filter from the hood. Tilt the filter downward and remove.

The grease filters should be cleaned frequently. Use a warm dishwasher detergent solution. Grease filters are dishwasher safe.

Clean all-metal filters in the dishwasher using a non-phosphate detergent. Discoloration of the filters may occur if using phosphate detergents, or as a result of local water conditions - but this will not affect filter performance. This discoloration is not covered by the warranty. To minimize or prevent discoloration, hand-wash filters using a mild detergent.

NON-DUCTED RECIRCULATION FILTERS

The non-ducted recirculation filters should be changed every 6 months. Replace more often if your cooking style generates extra grease, such as frying and wok cooking. Turn the filter mounting tabs to remove filter and replace.

STAINLESS STEEL CLEANING

DO:

- Regularly wash with clean cloth or rag soaked with warm water and mild soap or liquid dish detergent.
- Always clean in the direction of original polish lines.
- Always rinse well with clear water (2 or 3 times) after cleaning. Wipe dry completely.
- You may also use a specialized household stainless steel cleaner.

DON'T:

- Use any steel or stainless steel wool or any other scrapers to remove stubborn dirt.
- Use any harsh or abrasive cleaners.
- Allow dirt to accumulate.
- Let plaster dust or any other construction residues reach the hood. During construction/renovation, cover the range hood to make sure no dust sticks to the stainless steel surface.

AVOID: WHEN CHOOSING A DETERGENT

- Any cleaners that contain bleach will attack stainless steel.
- Any products containing: chloride, fluoride, iodide, bromide will deteriorate surfaces rapidly.
- Any combustible products used for cleaning such as acetone, alcohol, ether, benzol, etc., are highly explosive and should never be used close to a range.

PAINTED FINISH CLEANING

Clean with warm water and mild detergent only. If discoloration occurs, use a finish polish such as automotive polish. (DO NOT use rough abrasive cleaner or porcelain cleaner.)
