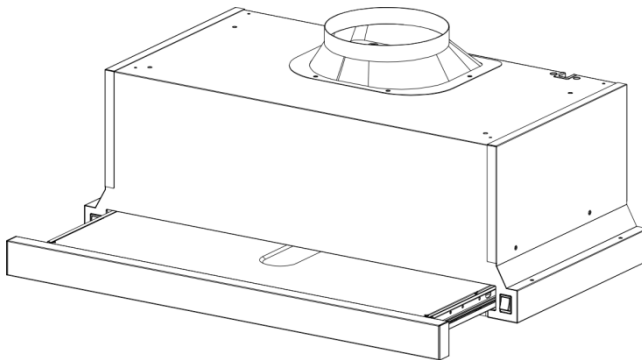

READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING - to reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, or injury, read the following:

- Read all instructions before using the appliance.
- Use of this appliance is only for its intended purpose as described in this manual.
- Do not use any accessories that are not recommended by the manufacturer.
- This unit must be grounded.
- Do not use this appliance for commercial use.
- Do not use with any solid-state speed control device.
- Installation work and electrical wiring must be done by qualified technicians in accordance with all applicable regulations, codes & standards, including fire rated construction.
- Sufficient air is needed for proper exhausting of gases of fuel burning equipment to prevent backdraft. Follow the manufacturers guidelines and safety standards.
- When replacing an existing range hood with your new AEG range hood, turn OFF the electrical power to the existing unit before removal.
- Unplug the unit before cleaning or servicing.
- Do not attempt to repair or replace any parts without first calling for service. **Note:** If for any reason this product requires service, please contact Euro-Parts 1-800-561-4614.
- Be careful not to damage existing electrical wiring and/or any other hidden utilities when cutting or drilling into the wall or ceiling.

WARNING to reduce risk of cooktop grease fires:

- Never leave cooking unattended at high temperatures. Boil overs can cause smoke and grease oil spillovers may ignite.
- Use pans of the same size as the elements/ burners are suitable for the amount of food being cooked.
- Always turn the hood OFF when cooking at high temperatures and with high flame foods. E.g., crepe suzettes, cherry jubilees and flambés.
- Clean ventilation fans frequently. Do not allow grease to accumulate on the fan or filters.
- Heat oils and fats slowly on low or medium settings.

WARNING – to reduce the risk of personal injury in the event of a cooktop fire:

- Smother flames with a close-fitting lid, metal tray or metal baking sheet. Turn the burner OFF. Avoid burning yourself. Call the fire department if the flames do not extinguish immediately and evacuate the area.
- Never pick up a flaming pan. Leave it on the cooking surface.
- Never use water or wet dish cloths or towels to extinguish a fire. A violent steam explosion may occur.
- Use a fire extinguisher only if
 - you have a Class ABC and you know how to use it.
 - The fire is small and contained.
 - The fire dept has been called.
 - You have an exit, use the extinguisher with your back to an exit.

CAUTION!

Important to observe all governing codes and ordinances.

- Use for general ventilation only. Never use this appliance to exhaust hazardous or explosive materials and vapors.
- Use only metal ductwork to reduce the risk of fire.

- Exhaust air from the rangehood into the room to reduce the risk of fire. Do not vent the exhausted air into the space between the wall or ceiling, into the attic, crawl space or garage.

CAUTION!

Grounding Instructions

- This appliance must be grounded. In case of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of an electrical shock by providing an escape wire for the electrical current. This appliance has a cord that has a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into a properly installed and grounded outlet.
- Improper grounding can result in electrical shock. Consult a qualified electrician when the grounding instructions are unclear or not understandable or when there is doubt that the appliance is correctly grounded.
- Never use an extension cord. When the power cord is too short have a qualified electrician install an outlet near the appliance.
- Never operate any hood with a damaged cord or plug. Discard or return to an authorized service facility for examination and or repair.

CAUTION

- Ensure adequate ventilation when the rangehood is used at the same time as appliances burning gas or other fuels (not applicable to appliances that only discharge air back into the room).

Installation Preparation

Note: this procedure requires 2 people for easier installation.

General Preparation

- Remove range hood from packaging and lay upside down on a table covered with cardboard or paper to prevent scratching of the hood or table.
- Check the power switch is set to OFF.

Tools needed for installation:

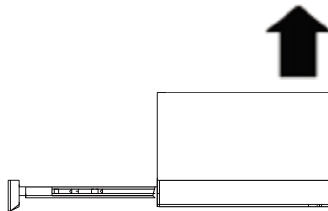
- Drill.
- 1/8" drill bit for pilot holes.
- 1-1/4" wood bit or drilling electrical wiring access hole.
- Phillips head screwdriver.
- Flat-head screwdriver.
- Pliers.
- Pencil, ruler, and level for marking range hood location.
- Hand saw or jig saw for cutting the wall or cabinet openings.
- Duct Tape.
- Electrical tape.
- Connector clamp.

Selecting The Venting Direction

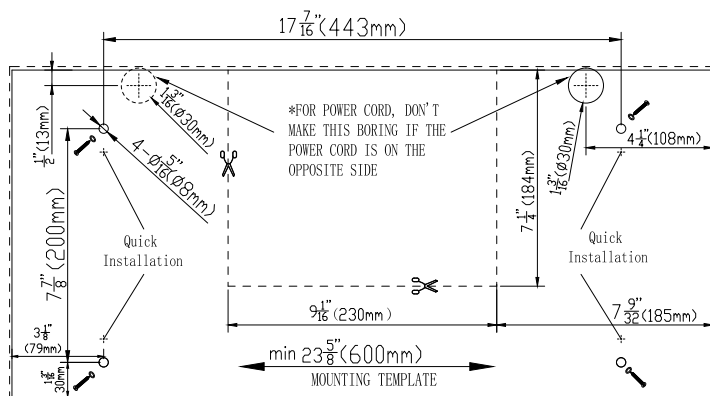
The rangehood is set up for vertical discharge.
This is the most common method of hood installation.

Option 1. If your kitchen has an attic space above, the ducting may be run through the cupboard and the attic to a roof cap. Use a 6inch round duct (not included).

Option 2. If your kitchen has a soffit above the cabinet, the ducting may be run up into the soffit and then through the outside wall to a wall cap.

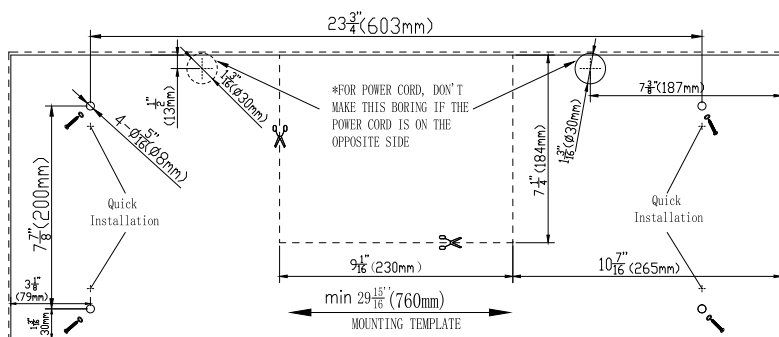
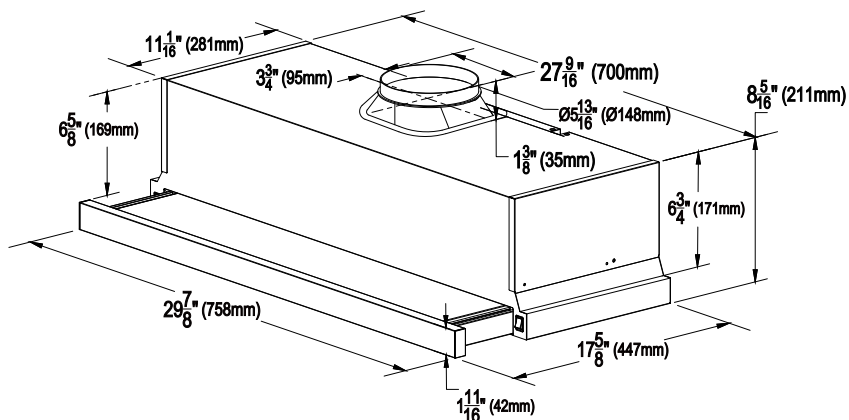

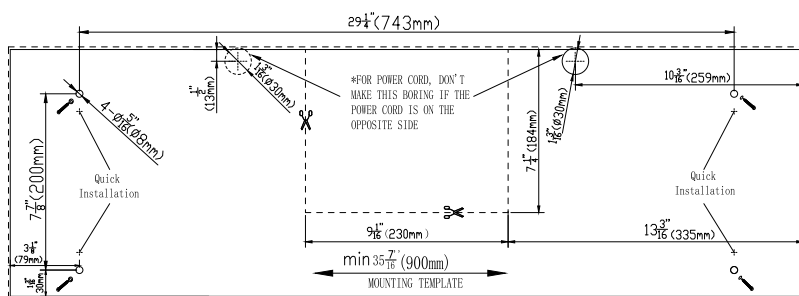


Installation Diagram For External Venting

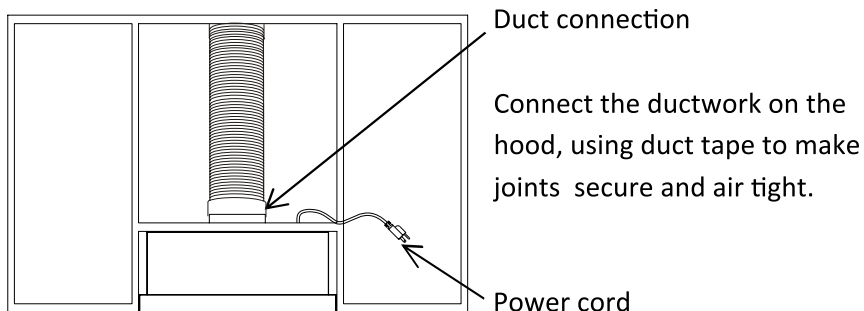

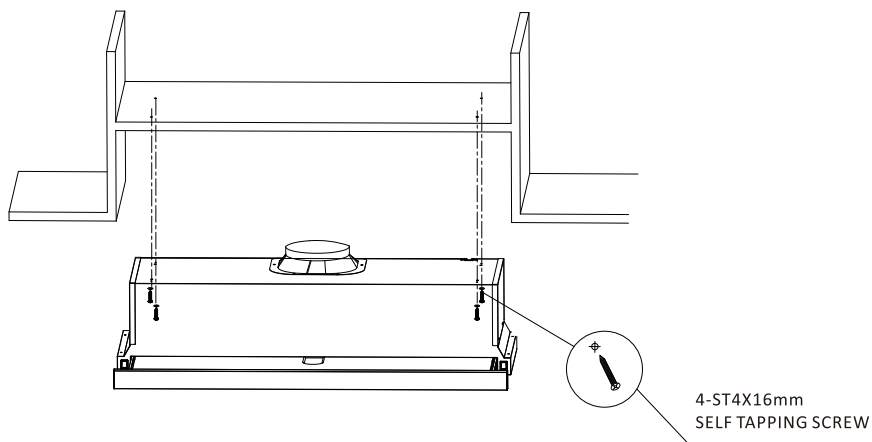


Hood Installation



Your new range hood will operate at the highest efficiency if the number of elbows and the length of the duct are kept to a max of 15ft. (Note 1 x elbow=4ft)

Quick Installation Method



Note: Do Not drill holes into the wood cabinet if using Quick Installation Method.

Cabinet Preparation For Hood Support

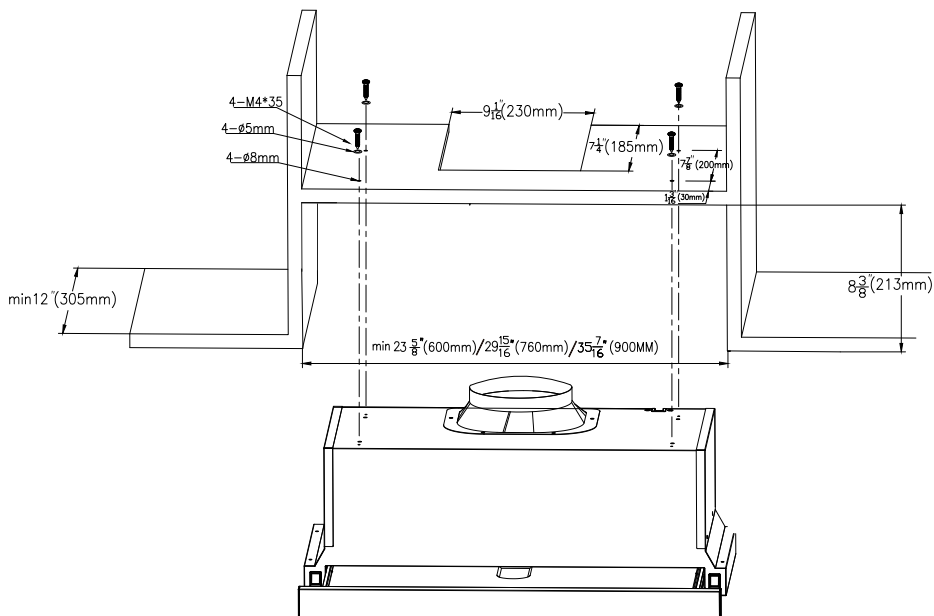
The range hood should be mounted at a minimum distance of 24" (610mm) above the cooking surface for safety and optimum performance.

Note: Bottom hinges should be installed at 9" or more above the cabinet base.



To install the hood with a duct, you will need to provide a hole for the duct. Please use the template provided to correctly place the hole.

Use the diagram below for correct placement of ductwork and electrical cutout in cabinets.



Note: Installation based on 5/8" wide cabinet gables.

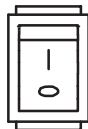
WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, USE ONLY METAL DUCTWORK AND DUCT CONNECTION DEVICES.

Warning!

When cutting or drilling into walls or cabinets be careful not to cut existing electrical wiring.

Measure and mark the electrical wiring opening on the wall or cabinet. For vented hoods mark and measure the duct opening on the wall or cabinet.

Use and Care

Filter

For highest efficiency, the metal filter should be removed and cleaned once a month.

Soak the filter in hot water with a mild soap or detergent. Rinse thoroughly and repeat if necessary. The filter is also dishwasher safe. Heavy grease buildup may not be cleaned easily, therefore the filter may need to be replaced.

Light Bulb

This model requires 2 x 1W LED light bulbs, available from Euro-parts 1-800-561-4614.

Exterior surface

Do NOT use abrasive materials such as steel wool pads or scouring pads.

Wipe the rangehood exterior with a soft cloth and a mild detergent suitable for painted surfaces.

Repairs or Replacement Parts

Warning! Disconnect the range hood from the electrical power supply before servicing.

All parts may be obtained from Euro-Parts 1-800-561-4614.

When ordering parts, please specify the range hood model number located on the rating label, which can be found on the inside of the range hood.

Trouble Shooting

When any problems occur, unplug the hood from the electrical outlet and contact Euro-Parts or an authorized servicer in order to avoid an accident.

Fan does not turn on (but light turns on).

This is probably due to either a defective fan switch or a burned-out fan motor. Use an OHM meter to determine which component is not working.

If the OHM meter reads that the fan switch has 0 x OHM of resistance, then it is the motor that needs to be replaced. If it reads anything other than zero, then the switch must be replaced.

Please contact Euro-Parts or an authorized servicer to fix this problem.

Light does not turn on (but fan turns on).

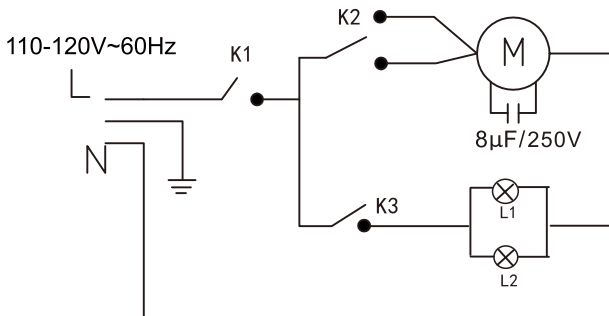
This could be because the bulb has burned out. Try replacing the light bulb. If the light still does not work, either the light switch or the lamp-holder socket could be defective .

Rangehood does not turn on.

Check for a tripped circuit breaker or a blown fuse.

Note: All work must be done by a qualified licensed technician.

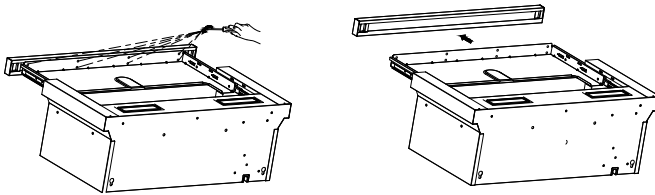

Front Custom Handle Replacement

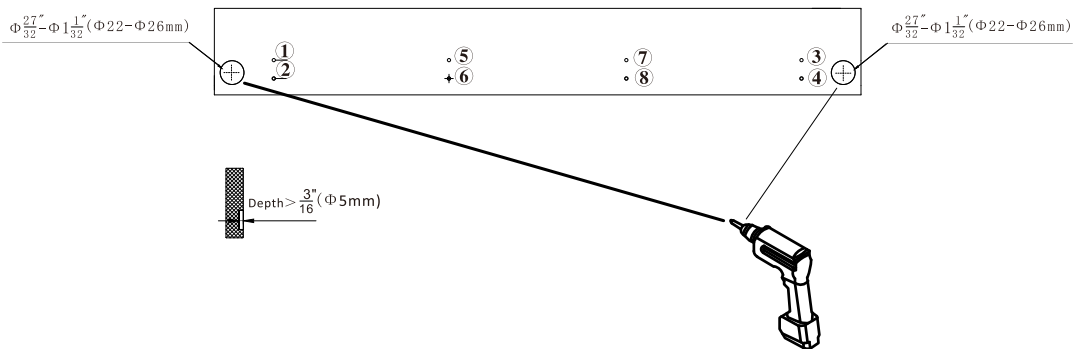
The front stainless steel (SS) handle can be removed and replaced with your own custom handle as follows.

1. Unscrew the 8 screws holding the SS handle in place as picture 1.
2. Bore 2 holes in each underside of the handle as shown.
This will stop your handle hitting the switches.
3. Place your handle onto the frame and screw into place. Ensure the order of tightening the screws is as per picture 2.

CAUTION!

Do not pick up the unit from the side handles to reduce twisting and misalignment.

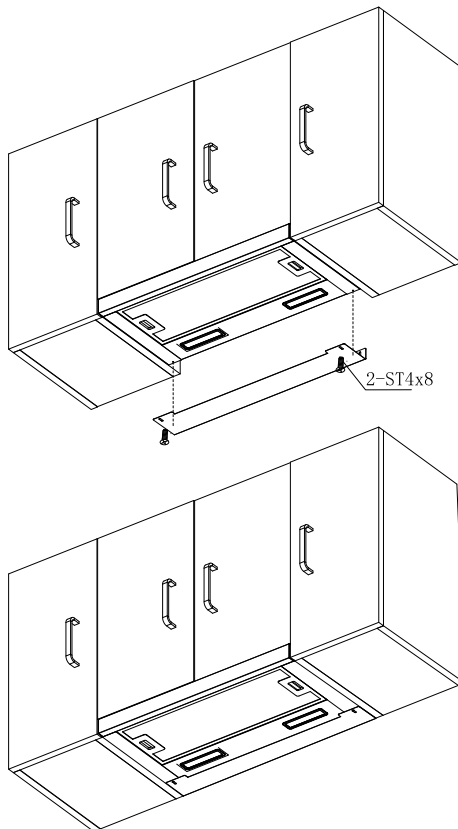
Note: This is an option to the existing stainless steel handle.

Adjusting Bracket Usage

If there is a gap between the back of the hood and the wall after the hood is installed, it can be covered at the rear with the adjusting bracket.

There are 2 sides to the bracket, the short side accommodates a 12" depth cabinet and the long side accommodates a 15" depth cabinet. Install the bracket on the hood with two ST4*8 screws.

Note: If the bracket covers the filter a little or leaves a small gap in the rear, it can be adjusted to the perfect position by using the slotted mounting holes.

TWO YEAR FULL WARRANTY:

From original date of purchase, including parts and labour to the first registered purchaser of this appliance to repair or replace any part which is deemed a factory or workmanship defect or material defect.

THIS WARRANTY DOES NOT COVER COMMERCIAL USE.

The name Euro-Line Appliances, for service matters, incorporates work performed by authorized service agents or service companies.

EXCEPTIONS –EURO-LINE WILL NOT PAY FOR THE FOLLOWING SERVICE CALLS:

1. To install or correct the installation of an appliance.
2. To provide instruction on the use of an appliance.
3. To replace house fuses, re-set circuit breakers or correct house wiring.
4. To correct house plumbing.
5. To clean drains, filters or garbage disposals.
6. To remove shipping brackets.
7. To repair an appliance if it fails due to misuse or abuse, ie. – use of incorrect laundry detergent, you MUST use the recommended low sudsing detergent.
8. To repair or replace any part damaged resulting from foreign objects caught in the appliance.
9. To repair cosmetic damage to the appliance (cracked/broken glass components, scratches to stainless steel components), unless such damage results from a defect in the workmanship or materials. Such damage must be reported to AEG within 5 days from the date of purchase.
