R600A REFRIGERANT

This product contains R600a isobutane refrigerant, which is a very ecofriendly natural gas. However, it is also flammable. Please follow the warnings and installation instructions below:

- If the product has been transported horizontally, you must wait a minimum of 4 hours after standing it upright before plugging it in.
- Cut-out dimensions of the installation area must be suitable to safely fit the product for full installation.
- Dimensions, features, and position of objects used to support and affix the product to this area must be suitable.
- Minimum clearances between product parts and surrounding structures must be suitable.
- Minimum dimensions and proper organization of ventilation holes must be observed.
- The product must be connected to the main power outlet, and corresponding connections of other components must be suitable.
- The product must be able to be disconnected from the power supply if needed after installation.
- The outlet or fuse must be accessible to disconnect the product.
- Extension cables or ungrounded (two-terminal) adapters must not be used with this unit.



You must wear gloves and eye protectors when installing the product.

You must also take measures against high noise levels when using a drill to drill into the floor or wall.



Make sure that your product is suitable for your local codes.



The product must be installed by a qualified technician according to the installation instructions.



The product may tip over since it is quite heavy. For this reason, safety precautions must be taken. The doors of the product must be kept closed until it reaches the final install destination, and it must be transported in accordance with the installation instructions.





INSTALLATION ENCLOSURE

You must follow the instructions below:

- The floor on which the product will be installed must be capable of bearing a minimum of 1,200 pounds (544 kilograms).
- The kitchen floor and bottom of the product must be at the same level. Otherwise, the air flow for the unit's cooling system may be impeded or reduced.
- There must be no objects preventing installation of the product to the back and side walls of the product's cut-out installation area.
- The electrical outlet receptacle must be properly located and easily accessed.
- Cut-out dimensions of the cabinets where the product will be installed must be in strict conformity with the dimensions given in this manual.
- Do not install a refrigerator or freezer directly adjacent to another unit unless using the appropriate joining kit. Otherwise, condensation and damage may occur. (Please see "Dual Cabin Installation" on page 10 for imagery.)
- Check if the floor where the product will be installed is level. Use a level when doing so to be sure.
- The installation area must not be subjected to direct sunlight and it must be away from heat sources, such as microwaves, ovens, radiators, etc.
- The ambient temperature must be between 61 °F and 90 °F (16 °C and 32 °C), depending on where the unit is installed. Otherwise, function errors may occur when the product is running.
- If it is not possible to avoid installing the product near a heat source, the minimum clearances given below must be maintained:
 - 2" (51 mm) from electric ranges or ovens.
 - 12" (305 mm) from gas or fuel operated ranges or ovens.

Please observe the following rules:

- The dedicated circuit breaker for this unit must be easily accessible in case of an emergency; it must not be hidden behind the product.
- The electrical plug and cord must not touch the back surface of the product. Otherwise, it may get damaged due to the vibration of the product.
- Do not plug in other appliances behind this product.
- If the humidity level is high where the product is used, corrosion may occur on the outer surface of the product. Keep the area where the unit will be installed dry and well-cleaned to avoid corrosion.



To avoid the risk of electric shock:

- Connect the plug to a dedicated grounded electrical outlet.
- Do not remove the ground terminal of the plug.
- Do not use adapters.
- Do not use extension cables or cords.



Do not install your refrigerator or freezer:

- In open areas.
- In environments where water is dripping.
- In environments where temperature is lower than 61 °F (16 °C).



Failure to follow these instructions may result in death, fire, or electric shock. Connecting the grounding conductor of the equipment to an improper place may lead to electric shock. Please have the grounding checked by a qualified electrician or service technician.

Installation, repair, and other procedures performed by unqualified persons may cause danger. Before installing the appliance, make sure that the voltage, load, and circuit current parameters on the data plate are in compliance with the power mains in your house.

The appliance is provided with a NEMA 5-15P plug and a 3-pin power cable, which is UL listed and ready to be connected to a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power supply. The fuse is 15 amps, and the appliance must be connected to a dedicated electrical outlet.

If combining multiple units, ZLINE recommends all be plugged into independent circuits. They can be plugged into the same outlet, but the circuit must have a dedicated 15-amp breaker.

If the electrical wiring or power supply of the house needs alteration, the necessary procedures must be performed by a qualified electrician. The plug must be installed only by a licensed electrician.

CABINETS

- Make sure that the cabinets where you will install the appliance have been safely mounted in your kitchen. Your cabinets must be securely connected to the floor and walls properly and with suitable connections.
- For the best installation, clearances between the cabinets and the product must be in compliance with the values specified in the installation instructions of this manual.
- Side walls must be free of any obstructions and their surfaces must be flat.
- NOTE: Minimum thickness of the side walls is 5/8" (16 mm). The minimum thickness of the doors to be attached to the product must be 3/4" (19 mm). For a 25" (635 mm) flush inset depth, the maximum door panel thickness is 15/16" (24 mm).

VENTILATION

Ventilation panels where the air enters and exits the unit must not be blocked or obstructed. In addition, you must periodically clean the dust and dirt that accumulates on the vent holes to ensure adequate ventilation.

ELECTRICAL CONNECTION

- Never use an extension cable or cord with this unit.
- The dedicated electrical outlet receptacle for this unit must be grounded and checked by an authorized electrician.
- The location of the electrical wiring must comply with the dimensions specified in this installation manual.



RISK OF FLECTRIC SHOCK

Electrical grounding is necessary. This appliance is equipped with a 3-pin plug to protect you against possible electric shocks.

- Do not remove the round grounding terminal from the plug.
- Do not use 2-pin grounding adapters.
- Do not use extension cables or cords to energize the product.



Do not connect the grounding cable to any gas pipes. Please have the grounding checked by a qualified electrician if you are not sure about the grounding of the product. Do not install a fuse on the neutral line or grounding circuit.



Please wait 3-6 hours after installing the unit before plugging it in to protect it against possible damages. This way, the refrigerant and the lubricants in the system are given proper time to balance.

WATER CONNECTION

The pressure of the main water supply must be in compliance with the values specified in this manual, and the location of the water system must comply with the dimensions specified in this manual.



Using the provided water filter bypass plug is recommended for the unit's water filtering system if a reverse osmosis system is used. Reference the User Manual for directions on how to install the water filter and/or the bypass plug.


ALTERNATIVES FOR INSTALLATION

- The product can be placed in various ways based on the kitchen design. It must be installed at a place where it is ensured that the door can be opened and closed properly.
- If the doors cannot be opened 90° at least, you cannot completely open the drawers inside
 the product. NOTE: The unit's hinges are designed to allow doors to open up to 115°.





PREPARATION FOR INSTALLATION AND CABINET CUTOUTS

- ZLINE column refrigerators and freezers are panel-ready appliances designed to be a
 permanent kitchen fixture; therefore, precise cutouts and superior attention to detail are
 required for seamless integration, especially if custom panels are installed. The most common
 scenario is the unit is installed between two kitchen cabinets or decorative columns.
- The refrigerator comes with a 2 9/16" (65 mm) stainless steel toe kick installed to fit a standard 84" (2134 mm) tall cabinet.
- NOTE: Kitchen layouts may vary, so recommended dimensions must be confirmed by a qualified technician before starting the installation.




CABINETRY PLANNING

NOTE: If you have an existing framed cabinet, you need to add a filler behind the face frame in order to properly mount the side brackets. If you don't have a filler, you'll have a gap and won't be able to safety install your unit(s).

LOCATION OF THE ELECTRICAL WIRING


- The location of the electrical outlet must be within the range provided below.
- Using an outlet with a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) is not recommended.



Do not use extension cables or cords or 2-pin adapters, and do not remove the ground terminal of the grounding cable.



A qualified electrician must ensure that the poles of the socket are connected correctly. A qualified electrician must also verify that the grounding of the socket is correct.




LOCATION OF THE WATER SYSTEM

- The water connected to the unit must be potable.
- The location of the water system must be within the range provided below.
- The unit's water system must be connected to the main water system in the house. The user
 must be able to switch the water system on/off with a valve when necessary.
- Objects that may pierce the water hoses or cause them to twist must not be present where
 the water line is installed.
- Pressure of the water system must be between 25-80 psi (1.7-5.5 bar).
- If the water pressure exceeds 80 psi (5.5 bar), install a pressure-limiting device or water pressure protector to the inlet valve. Never install or operate the appliance if it's possible for the water pressure to exceed 120 psi (8.3 bar).



- Make sure there is no leakage when making water connections. Otherwise, there will be water on the floor and the cabinets may get damaged.
- You will need a hose with a minimum length of 60" (1524 mm) and a diameter of 1/4" (6 mm) for water connections of the product during installation.
- A connector that has a thread with an external diameter of 1/4" (6 mm) must be used to connect the hose end to the product.
- Before completing installation, make sure water flows and there is no leakage. Damage may occur if leaks are present.




DUAL CABIN ELECTRICAL AND WATER REQUIREMENTS

- Each appliance is provided with a NEMA 5-15P plug and a 3-pin power cable designed to be connected to a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power receptacle.
- Therefore, we recommend both units be plugged into independent circuits. They can be
 plugged into the same outlet, but please note the circuit must have a dedicated 15-amp
 breaker that is not shared with any other appliance to avoid exceeding the combined
 power requirements.
- From a water standpoint, while both units also come with their own water supply, a
 qualified technician can easily tee off the water supply to provide water to both units if the
 customer desires.
- Refer to the diagrams below and on the following page, and please refer to the earlier sections for additional information for electrical and water requirements and other installation needs.






- Check if the floor where the appliance will be installed is perfectly level.

UNPACKING


- Use a box cutter to remove tape on the box packaging.
- Cut the box packaging through the section illustrated in dotted lines in the figure below and remove it.
- If this refrigerator was purchased with door panels, the panels and handles ship in multiple boxes and require additional assembly upon installation.
- Please note the diagrams on the following pages will alternate showing the appliance with and without panels installed; this is done purposefully to show how the item will look panelready versus with panel installed.
- Door panel preparation and installation is covered starting on page 54.



Due to refrigerators and freezers weighing between 243 and 345 pounds (110 and 156 kilograms), at least two people must move units when unpacking and installing.





REMOVING THE VENT HOLE ASSEMBLY

Remove the five screws to take out the vent assembly; set the screws aside.

MOUNTING THE ANTI-TIP BRACKETS



Anti-tip brackets must be installed to prevent the appliance from tipping over and limit risk of injury.




Make sure there is no electrical or water connection where the screws will be tightened and connections will be established.



Please remember to use necessary protective equipment when drilling holes in the wall while performing this installation.





• Use a 5/16" (8 mm) drill bit to bore roughly 2 1/2" (62 mm) deep holes at the marked points. Do not use a larger drill bit as the wall anchors will be unable to tighten or secure the brackets.




MOUNTING THE ANTI-TIP BRACKETS

• Use the hammer to tap anti-tip anchors (page 26, Item No. 2) into the wall.



• Fit the anti-tip brackets into their places, using four screws (page 26, Item No. 1) for each. You must use both brackets to ensure safety of the product.





- If you are not sure whether the anti-tip brackets are fastened to the wall as securely as they should be, you can use alternative anti-tip methods.
- If there are cabinets at the back wall of the refrigerator or freezer, please
 make sure the cabinets are fixed to the wall. For this, you need to ensure the
 back wall of the cabinets are fixed to the concrete back wall with suitable
 connection parts.


INSTALLATION

ALTERNATIVE ANTI-TIP METHOD

- If the anti-tip brackets cannot be connected securely, you must use the alternative method outlined below.
- In this method, you can use wooden blocks (not provided) to avoid the risk of the unit tipping over. They must be installed as illustrated in the figure below.
- There must be no clearance between the product and the wooden blocks.
- Minimum section dimensions of the wooden block must be 3" by 4" (76 mm by 102 mm).
 The width of the blocks must be equal to the clearance where it will be installed.
- An additional block must be used if the niche depth is more than anticipated. The wooden block must contact the product with a maximum depth of 2" (51 mm).
- To determine the location for the wooden block, mark it on the rear wall, select suitable screws, and connect safely.




The number and type of the screws to be used for the wooden block must be determined so there is a secure connection. Only a professional installer should perform this alternative method.




PREPARING THE WATER HOSE AND POWER PLUG

- You will need a hose with a minimum length of 60" (1524 mm) and a diameter of 1/4"
 (6 mm) for water connections during installation.
- A connector that has a thread with an external diameter of 1/4" (6 mm) must be used to connect the hose end to the product.
- You can choose method A or method B below to prevent the power cord and water supply line from getting jammed or tangled.

Method A: Locate the water hose and power supply on the back of your cabinet.






MOVING THE UNIT FROM THE WOODEN PALLET

• With a Phillips-head screwdriver or drill bit, remove the screws from the security brackets that connect the refrigerator or freezer to the wooden pallet as outlined below.



With at least two people, recline the appliance with the help of a dolly/hand truck to lift it
off the pallet and Styrofoam packaging, then slowly lower the refrigerator to the floor. Then,
use the hand truck to carefully move the unit near the opening of the cabinet cutout where
it will be installed.






Do not open doors, as the weight of the unit's doors can cause the appliance to tip over while in a reclined or free standing position.

PREPARING FOR PLACING THE UNIT INTO THE CABINET

Before preparing to push the unit into the cabinet cutout, run the water line hose through the
rear channel of the refrigerator or freezer (below image, right circle) to the front of the unit
(below, left). You can optionally tape the water line to the floor to avoid it getting tangled
during installation.



 Plug in the refrigerator or freezer to make sure the power is working and that the display has been activated.




The plug of the product must be accessible after installation. If the plug is not accessible after installation, the power must be cut off from the main switch.



You can use tape or other protective items you think are necessary to protect the edges of the cabinet when placing the product.

PLACING THE UNIT INTO THE CABINET

• Apply the below method — tie a nylon string or other durable string/cable around the power cord — to prevent the power cord from getting jammed.





Make sure the power cable is not jammed when placing the product, or else you increase the risk of electric shock or power failure.

- Push the product carefully toward the cabinet cutout. If there is strain of any kind during placement of the product into the cabin:
 - the floor might be rough or uneven; and/or
 - adjustable feet might be loose (please see page 38 to learn how to adjust the adjustable feet to level the product).


ALIGNING THE UNIT WITH THE CABINET CUTOUT



It is very important to align the upper edge of both doors when aligning. All the other edges can be adjusted with the adjustment mechanisms.

NOTE: The image below is of a refrigerator or freezer with panels installed in order to show proper gaps when aligning the door.

- 1/8" (3 mm) represents the required gap between door panels and the cabinet cutout.
- These gap measurements are the same for custom panels and ZLINE-provided panels.




ADJUSTING THE REFRIGERATOR HEIGHT

- With the unit now aligned, push it carefully into the cabinet cutout.
- Next, the feet need to be raised in order to secure the product to the anti-tip brackets.
- You may use a socket wrench with a 1/4" hex bit to adjust leg height; we recommend using
 a socket wrench by hand to avoid the risk of stripping the legs. Do not use an impact drill
 to adjust the feet; doing so may cause damage.






USING THE POSITION ALIGNMENT GAUGE







INSTALLING THE WATER CONNECTION

With the unit secured into the cabinet cutout, use two wrenches to firmly connect the main
water line hose from the front of the unit to the hose coming from the valve above, as
outlined in the image below.




- Once the water connection is complete, you must turn on the main water valve to ensure there are no water leaks.
- This also allows you to run water through the unit's water dispenser to drain the water filtration system before use.
- If necessary, use the box cutter to cut the water hose from the end of the pipe it comes out of, leaving a section of 10" (254 mm) length to avoid excess length.
- Use the 2 wrenches to firmly connect the hose coming from the mains and the hose coming from the valve.



Pressure of the water system must be between 25-80 psi (1.7-5.5 bar).



Once the water connection is complete, you must turn on the mains valve and make sure that there is no leakage at that point.





WATER SAFETY MEASURES


- The main water line hose must be one piece. Do not use extension hoses.
- Make sure power to the unit is turned off from the breaker when making the water connection of the product to limit risk of electric shock.
- The water valve must be off when connecting the water hose.
- It is recommended that the water on/off valve remains accessible after installing the product in the event service is needed.
- This product is suitable for use with cold water mains only.
- The pressure of the water system must be between 25-80 psi (1.7-5.5 bar).
- If the water pressure exceeds 80 psi (5.5 bar), install a pressure-limiting device or water pressure protector to the inlet valve. Never install or operate the appliance if it's possible for the water pressure to exceed 120 psi (8.3 bar).
- If the water pressure is lower than 14.5 psi (1 bar), you can use an auxiliary pump to compensate.
- If you do not know how to check the water pressure or are unsure how to utilize an auxiliary pump, please consult a professional plumber.

DUAL CABIN INSTALLATION

- If combining multiple units, please note both refrigerators and freezers have a
 dedicated water supply, each requiring a hose with a minimum length of 60"
 (1524 mm) and a diameter of 1/4" (6 mm) for proper water connections.
- If the plumbing of your home needs alteration to accommodate built-in refrigeration, a
 qualified technician or professional plumber may tee off the water supply to provide water
 to both units if the customer desires.
- Read more about dual unit installation on page 10.







CHOOSING THE DOOR THICKNESS


The door(s) of your refrigerator can open by 115° maximum. If the door is going to open to this degree, you can choose the following thickness levels depending on your door panels:

• If the door thickness is more than 1 1/2" (38 mm), the door should not open more than 90°. You must use a limiting pin on the hinge.



LIMITING PINS

- To limit the opening degree of your door to 90°, insert one 90° limiting pin (page 26, Item No. 17) into the hole on the bottom hinge outlined in the images on the previous page.
- The 90° limit pin (Item No. 17) is located in the mounting part kit of the drawer box.
- The pin must be fully seated in the bracket or the door will not close properly.





COVERAGE

ZLINE Kitchen and Bath ("ZLINE") column refrigerators and freezers have a two year parts and service warranty and a five year parts warranty on the unit's sealed cooling system.

TERMS

Any warranty claim stemming from installation, operation, or any other use within a commercial setting is not covered under this limited warranty. This warranty is non-transferable and will not under any circumstance be extended based on the date of installation — the warranty period takes effect from the date of delivery and only covers the original purchaser. The warranty applies only to products installed in the contiguous United States and the District of Columbia.

Failure to secure certified warranty service per these terms will result in a forfeiture of the remaining warranty. Out-of-pocket payments will not be reimbursed unless prior approval is received from ZLINE and/or ZLINE-certified service contract partners. Unapproved out-of-pocket payments for service will not be reimbursed. All warranty procedures must be followed to maintain warranty coverage.

If a product qualifies within the service window provided under these warranty terms, and ZLINE is unable to repair the product or a defective part of the product after a reasonable number of attempts, ZLINE reserves the right to offer to replace the defective part or the product or provide the original purchaser a full refund of the purchase price of the product (not including installation, removal, or other charges that were not included in the original purchase price).

The original purchaser of the product must provide the original proof of purchase, including the purchase date, when filing a claim to obtain replacement parts, service, or refunds. Additionally, the original purchaser of the product must provide the serial number of the product when filing a claim to obtain replacement parts, service, or refunds.

This warranty shall not apply to any ZLINE product in which the original factory serial number has been removed, altered, or cannot be readily determined for any reason. Further, ZLINE is not responsible for damage resulting from, but not limited to: shipment, delivery, or improper installation; negligence or improper maintenance, misuse, or abuse of the product; unauthorized alteration, modification, or tampering with the product; accident, fire, floods, pest infestations, pandemics, natural disasters, or any other unpreventable or unexplained acts of nature, commonly referred to as "acts of God"; flare-up fires or damages caused by improper electric supply, electrical line current, voltage, or power surges; and service to correct installation not in accordance with the instructions contained in ZLINE's product manuals and/or with local government codes.

In the event service is dispatched, and it is discovered that the reported issue is not covered under warranty based on the disclaimers above, the customer will be responsible for all service fees. Failure to pay these fees will result in the forfeiture of remaining warranty coverage.

Information contained within ZLINE's installation and user manuals, in addition to product information included on ZLINE's website and all related digital listings, do not cover every possible condition and situation that may occur during the installation or operation of ZLINE products.
