

Grounding


(Except for devices which are not grounded.) Ensure that you connect the earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock (i.e. a TV with a three-prong grounded AC plug must be connected to a three-prong grounded AC outlet). If grounding methods are not possible, have a qualified electrician install a separate circuit breaker. Do not try to ground the unit by connecting it to telephone wires, lightning rods, or gas pipes.



- As long as this unit is connected to the AC wall outlet, it is not disconnected from the AC power source even if the unit is turned off.
- Do not attempt to modify this product in any way without written authorization from LG Electronics. Unauthorized modification could void the user's authority to operate this product.
- Outdoor Antenna Grounding (Can differ by country):

If an outdoor antenna is installed, follow the precautions below. Cleaning

When cleaning, unplug the power cord and wipe gently with a soft cloth to prevent scratching. Do not spray water or other liquids directly on the TV as electric shock may occur. Do not clean with chemicals such as alcohol, thinners, or benzine.

Moving

Make sure the product is turned off, unplugged, and all cables have been removed. It may take 2 or more people to carry larger TVs. Do not press or put stress on the front panel of the TV.

Ventilation

Install your TV where there is proper ventilation. Do not install in a confined space such as a bookcase. Do not cover the product with cloth or other materials while plugged. Do not install in excessively dusty places.

- If you smell smoke or other odors coming from the TV, unplug the power cord and contact an authorized service center.
- Keep the product away from direct sunlight.
- Never touch this apparatus or antenna during a lightning storm.
- When mounting a TV on the wall, make sure not to install the TV by hanging the power and signal cables on the back of the TV.
- Do not allow an impact shock, any objects to fall into the product, and do not drop anything onto the screen.

ENGLISH

Dot Defect

The panel is a high technology product with resolution of two million to six million pixels. In a very few cases, you could see fine dots on the screen while you're viewing the TV. Those dots are deactivated pixels and do not affect the performance and reliability of the TV.

Generated Sound

Cracking noise A cracking noise that occurs when watching or turning off the TV is generated by plastic thermal contraction due to temperature and humidity. This noise is common for products where thermal deformation is required.

Electrical circuit humming/panel buzzing
A low level noise is generated from a
high-speed switching circuit, which supplies a
large amount of current to operate a product.
It varies depending upon the product.
This generated sound does not affect the
performance and reliability of the product.

- Take care not to touch the ventilation openings. When watching the TV for a long period, the ventilation openings may become hot. This does not affect the performance of the product or cause defects in the product.
- Do not install this product on a wall if it could be exposed to oil or oil mist. This may damage the product and cause it to fall.
- If the TV feels cold to the touch, there may be a small flicker when it is turned on. This is normal; there is nothing wrong with TV. Some minute dot defects may be visible on the screen, appearing as tiny red, green, or blue spots. However, they have no adverse effect on the TV's performance. Avoid touching the LCD screen or holding your finger(s) against it for long periods of time. Doing so may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.

Preventing image burn or burn-in on your TV screen







- If a fixed image displays on the TV screen for a long period of time, it will be imprinted and become a permanent disfigurement on the screen. This is image burn or burn-in and not covered by the warranty.
- If the aspect ratio of the TV is set to 4:3 for a long period of time, image burn may occur on the letterboxed area of the screen.
- Avoid displaying a fixed image on the TV screen for a long period of time (2 or more hours for LCD, 1 or more hours for the Plasma TV) to prevent image burn.

Lifting and Moving the TV


When moving or lifting the TV, read the following to prevent the TV from being scratched or damaged and for safe transportation regardless of its type and size.

/!\ CAUTION ₋

- Avoid touching the screen at all times, as this may result in damage to the screen.
- Do not place the product on the floor with its front facing down without padding. Failure to do so may result in damage to the screen.
- It is recommended to move the TV in the box or packing material that the TV originally
- Before moving or lifting the TV, disconnect the power cord and all cables.
- When holding the TV, the screen should face away from you to avoid damage.



 Hold the top and bottom of the TV frame firmly. Make sure not to hold the transparent part, speaker, or speaker grille area.



- Use at least two people to move a large TV.
- When transporting the TV by hand, hold the TV as shown in the following illustration.



- When transporting the TV, do not expose the TV to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When transporting the TV, keep the TV upright; never turn the TV on its side or tilt towards the left or right.





Step 1 Use 4 pcs BT 4 x 18 screws to install the stand.




Step 2 Use 2pcs BA 3.5 x 16 screws to install the stand to the TV set.



Mounting on a table

- 1 Lift and tilt the TV into its upright position on a table.
 - Leave a 10 cm (4 inches) (minimum) space from the wall for proper ventilation.



2 Connect the power cord to a wall outlet.



Mounting on a wall

An optional wall mount can be used with your LG Television. Consult with your local dealer for a wall mount that supports the VESA standard used by your TV model. Carefully attach the wall mount bracket at the rear of the TV. Install the wall mount bracket on a solid wall perpendicular to the floor. If you are attaching the TV to other building materials, please contact qualified personnel to install the wall mount. Detailed instructions will be included with the wall mount. We recommend that you use an LG brand wall mount. please use a wall mount bracket where the device is adequately secured to the wall with enough space to allow connectivity to external devices.



Make sure to use screws and wall mounts that meet the VESA standard. Standard dimensions for the wall mount kits are described in the following table.



MAKING CONNECTIONS


You can connect various external devices to the TV. Supported external devices are: HD receivers, DVD players, VCRs, audio systems, USB storage devices, PC, gaming devices, and other external devices. For more information on external device's connection, refer to the manual provided with each device.



- If you record a TV program on a DVD recorder or VCR, make sure to connect the TV signal input cable to the TV through a DVD recorder or VCR. For more information about recording, refer to the manual provided with the connected device.
- The external device connections shown may differ slightly from illustrations in this manual.
- Connect external devices to the TV regardless about the order of the TV port.
- If you connect a gaming device to the TV, use the cable supplied with the gaming device.
- Refer to the external equipment's manual for operating instructions.


Connecting to an antenna or cable

Connect an antenna, cable, or cable box to watch TV. The illustrations may differ from the actual items and an RF cable is optional.





 Make sure not to bend the copper wire of the RF cable.



 Complete all connections between devices, and then connect the power cord to the power outlet to prevent damage to your TV.




Other connections (For Model 60LB5200 /65LB5200)

Connect your TV to external devices. For the best picture and audio quality, connect the external device and the TV with the HDMI cable as shown. Depending upon the model, a cable may be provided. When connect DVD etc. devices to the COMPONENT port, please remember to use the component adapter cable.



Other connections (For Model 32LB520B)

Connect your TV to external devices. For the best picture and audio quality, connect the external device and the TV with the HDMI cable as shown. Depending upon the model, a cable may be provided.




REMOTE CONTROL

The descriptions in this manual are based on the buttons on the remote control. Please read this manual carefully and use the TV correctly. To install batteries, open the battery cover, replace batteries (1.5 V AAA) matching the \bigoplus and \bigcirc ends to the label inside the compartment, and close the battery cover. Failure to match the correct polarities of the battery may cause the battery to burst or leak, resulting in fire, personal injury, or ambient pollution. To remove the batteries, perform the installation actions in reverse.



• Do not mix old and new batteries, as this may damage the remote control.

This remote uses infrared light. When in use, it should be pointed in the direction of the TV's remote sensor.



SETTINGS

To set up the channels automatically

SETTINGS ⇒ CHANNEL → Auto Tuning

Memorizes automatically the channels being broadcast.

- The channels will not be memorized properly if the antenna/cable is not installed correctly.
- Auto Tuning memorizes the channels that are currently being broadcast.

To use Energy Saving feature

SETTINGS ⇒ PICTURE → Energy Saving

Saves electric power by adjusting screen brightness.

- Off Turns off the Energy Saving.
- Minimum / Medium / Maximum Applies the pre-set Energy Saving.
- Screen Off Screen is turned off and only sound is played. Press any button on the remote control to turn the screen back on.

To select Picture Mode

SETTINGS ⇒ PICTURE → Picture Mode

Select the picture mode optimized for the viewing environment or the program.

- Vivid Heightens contrast, brightness and sharpness to display vivid images.
- **Standard** Displays images in standard levels of contrast, brightness and sharpness.
- Sport Weakens contrast, brightness and sharpness to display sport images.
- Cinema / Game Displays the optimum picture for movie, game.
- Backlight Selects the range of colors that can be expressed.
- Contrast Adjusts the difference between the light and dark areas of the picture. To get better picture value, Contrast should be adjusted to the proper value.
- Brightness Adjusts the brightness of the picture, and usually is adjusted together with Contrast
- Sharpness Adjusts the sharpness level of video performance.
- Color Adjusts the richness of colour.

- Tint Adjust the tint of the picture.
- Color Temperature Adjusts the overall tone of the screen as desired.
- Depending upon input signal or other picture settings, the range of detailed items for adjustment may differ.

To set additional picture options

SETTINGS ⇒ PICTURE → Picture Mode → Picture Option

Adjusts detailed setting for images.

- Noise Reduction Eliminates noise in the picture.
- MPEG Noise Reduction Eliminates noise generated while creating digital picture
- Black Level Adjusts the brightness and contrast of the screen to suit the black level.
- Real Cinema Optimizes the screen for movie
- Trumotion For 60LB5200 /65LB5200, select On or Off to control the MEMC feature.
- Depending upon input signal or other picture settings, the range of detailed items for adjustment may differ.

To set advanced control

SETTINGS ⇒ PICTURE → Picture Mode → Advanced Control

For each picture mode, screen can be calibrated; or for a special screen, picture settings can be adjusted. Select the desired picture mode.

- **Dynamic Contrast** Adjusts the contrast to the optimal level according to the image's brightness.
- Dynamic Color Adjusts colors to make the image appear in more natural colors.
- Skin Color Skin color spectrum can be separately set to implement the skin color as defined by the user.
- Grass Color Natural color spectrum (meadows, hills, etc.) can be separately set.
- Sky Color Sky color is set separately.
- Gamma Sets the gradation curve according to the output of picture signal in relation to the input signal.

To use auto volume

SETTINGS ⇒ AUDIO → Auto Volume

Activates the Auto Volume feature to keep the volume level consistent whenever you change channels. The volume level may not be consistent due to different signal conditions of broadcasting stations.

To select Sound Mode

SETTINGS ⇒ AUDIO → Sound Mode

Select the sound mode optimized for the viewing environment.

- Standard Offers standard-quality sound.
- Music Optimizes sound for listening to music.
- Cinema Optimizes sound for watching movies.
- Sport Optimizes sound for watching sports events.
- Game Optimizes sound for playing games.

To use TV speaker

SETTINGS ⇒ AUDIO → TV Speaker

Sound is output through the TV speaker.

To set Sleep Timer

SETTINGS ⇒ TIME → Sleep Timer

The sleep timer turns the TV off at the preset time, choices are Off, 10min, 20min, 30min, 60min, 90min, 120min, 180min and 240min.

To set the Clock

SETTINGS ⇒ TIME → Clock

- Auto clock setup The time is set automatically from a digital channel signal. In this mode, you can select a time zone and select to turn on/off the Daylight Saving function.
- Manual clock setup If the current time setting is wrong, reset the clock manually. If this TV is unplugged once or turn off with the AC power control switch on the TV, reset the clock function.

To set the password

SETTINGS ⇒ LOCK → Set Password

Set or change the TV password.

• The initial password is set to **0000**.

To set the caption

SETTINGS ⇒ OPTION → Caption

View captions when the TV station provides captioned programming. Program captions work only on digital/analog broadcasts or external input.

Change Caption to On and select caption settings.

Mode

To return to initial settings

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning your TV

Clean your TV regularly to keep it at peak performance and to extend the product's lifespan.

- Before cleaning, turn the power off and disconnect the power cord and all other cables.
- When the TV is left unattended or unused for a long time, disconnect the power cord from the wall. outlet to prevent possible damage from lightning or power surges.

Screen, frame, cabinet, and stand

To remove dust or light dirt, wipe the surface with a dry, clean, and soft cloth.

To remove major dirt, wipe the surface with a soft cloth dampened in clean water or a diluted mild detergent. Then wipe immediately with a dry cloth.



!\ CAUTION.

- Do not push, rub, or hit the surface with your fingernail or a sharp object, as this may result in scratches on the screen and image distortions.
- Do not use any chemicals, such as waxes, benzene, alcohol, thinners, insecticides, air fresheners, or lubricants, as these may damage the screen's finish and cause discoloration.
- Do not spray liquid onto the surface. If water enters the TV, it may result in fire, electric shock, or malfunction.

Power cord

Remove the accumulated dust or dirt on the power cord regularly.
